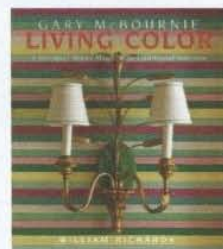

Several years back, the folks at Julian Chichester launched Mr. Brown (mrbrownhome.com), a line of casual furniture that epitomizes the phrase “tradition with a twist.” The pieces in the collection are based on classic shapes that possess unexpected qualities—like the new “Monaco” bench, *above*. 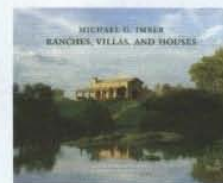
Gary McBournie
